

CRY JUST A LITTLE

The Beau Brummels, the most successful Rock Band ever to emerge from San Francisco formed in San Francisco in 1964. Sal Valentino (vocals), Ron Elliott (guitar & vocals), Ron Meagher (guitar), John Peterson (drums), and Declan Mulligan (bass), (who left the group in 1965, and later sued for damages after they became big), recorded for Tom Donahue's autumn label. The group's first two albums fused folk, country and R&B with "Laugh Laugh" (1964) reaching the Top 20 and "Cry Just A Little" (1965) reaching #8.

The band was the first nationally successful rock act to emerge from San Francisco; they were also the first American rock band influenced by the Beatles to have a hit. With the exception of their Irish-born bassist, Declan Mulligan, all the members were Bay Area high school graduates. Their early performances featured covers of Beatles and Rolling Stones songs as well as Ron Elliott's originals.

With a Searchers-like sound, the group was dubbed 'America's answer to the British Invasion'. They used 12- string guitar, soft harmonies, plaintive harmonica and minor-key melodies, along with Valentino's deep, tremulous delivery, to create a haunting sound that in turn spawned the Byrds and folk-rock.
